Your Weekly News & Updates

Our curriculum for this week is "Life on a Farm". Farming is important for our life. Farm animals produce many things for our life. In preschool farm animals theme children will learn how farm animals helps us as well as who and how to take care farm animals. There are many creative ways to incorporate the farm theme.

ART CENTER

Fruit and Vegetable Prints

Materials Needed: Cut different fruits and vegetables in half for the children to paint with. Try peppers, star fruit, apples, oranges...each make a great design on the paper!

Cotton Ball Sheep

Materials: Black paper, cotton balls, googly eyes Cool looking sheep!

BLOCK CENTER

Make a Barnyard. Provide plastic farm animal and farm equipment toys to make a barnyard.

DRAMATIC CENTER

Veterinarian. Put veterinarian prop box in dramatic area. Include item such as : stethoscope, thermometer, band aids and syringe, etc. Use stuffed animal as a patients.

Farmer. Gather farmer clothes and prop. Include hats, overall, boots, scarves, gardening toys such as : rake, shovel, watering can, etc.

LANGUAGE ART CENTER

Auditory Memory

The Animals Go Marching. Arrange three or four farm animal on the board. Say those in a specific order, and then ask one child to rearrange them in that order.

Skill : Auditory Discrimination

Name Two Words. Name two words that related with farm animal. If they are same, children stand up. If they are different, children sit down. For example : teacher say, "horse, horse", children stand up. Teacher say, "pig, cow", children sit down.

The word that you can use : turkey, pig, chicken, horse, duck, cow, sheep, piglet, chick, hen, rooster, calf, lamb, cock, gobble, bleat, crow, cluck, quack, barn, stable, farm, farmer etc.

MANIPULATIVE CENTER

Skill : Pouring and Spooning

Pouring and Spooning Grain. Provide different types of grain, such as : rice, corn, and wheat.

Have children pour grain over plastic tube. Give them a spoon and ask them to fill up the plastic tube with the grain.

MATH CENTER

Skill : Sorting and Sets

Big and Small Farm Animals. Provide 2 sets of farm animals. One set is big and then the second set is small. Make 2 sorting boxes made from shoe box. Let the children sort picture cards big and small objects.

SCIENCE CENTER

Tasting Dairy Product. Provide many types of milk product : cow milk, goat milk, skimmed milk, cottage cheese, sour cream, cream, yogurt, butter, cheese, and buttermilk. Encourage children to taste and smell. Let children compare the color and the texture.

Feather Observation. Observe various types of feathers. Duck, chicken and/or turkey feather. Use magnifying glass. Discuss their purposes, such as keeping animal warm. Put the feather in the water to see if they float. Talk to the children why they float.

COOK WITH KIDS

Cooking with children helps develop their math skills and helps them to learn how to follow directions. It also allows for some great conversation!
